1.	Minibeasts	Location: Butterfly House Up close encounter and handling of a variety of invertebrates, including Madagascan Hissing Cockroaches, Giant African millipedes, Vinegaroons, Stick insects, Tarantulas, and Giant African land snails. A great lesson to get children thinking about different types of minibeasts, where they would live, and what they might eat! <i>Minibeasts used may vary.</i>
2.	Feather, Fur and Scales	Location: Small Animal House (Canopy Seating Area) Up close encounter and hands on experience with animals such as Owls, Guinea pigs, Snakes, and Lizards. This talk is ideal for pupils to learn the basics of animal classification and discuss the characteristics of mammals, birds and reptiles, and what makes these groups of animals so different from one another. <i>Animals featured in this session may vary.</i>
3.	Animal Senses, Tropical Habitats & Adaptations	Location: Butterfly House Close encounter and hands on experience with exotic animals including Snakes, Madagascan Hissing Cockroaches, Giant African Millipedes, Tarantulas and Lesser Hedgehog Tenrecs. A great interactive lesson to get children thinking about exotic habitats such as rainforests; the animals that live within them, and what senses these animals might use to survive. <i>Animals featured in this session may vary.</i>
