Once the form has been completed, signed and returned to us, a full invoice will be raised for the visit based on the numbers stated. This invoice will be confirmation of your booking. Changes and cancellations can be made up to 14 days prior to your visit, any amendments made within this time will require original payment in full. 

Avoiding infection on farm visits Advice for the public

Farm visits and risks

Visiting a farm is an enjoyable and educational experience for many people, particularly children. However, visiting a farm carries a small risk of catching infection from animals or the environment. Farm animals can be the source of several bugs that can be passed from animals to humans and cause illness. Some can be particularly serious for children or pregnant women.

These bugs may not cause animals to be visibly ill so it's difficult to tell whether an animal is infected, especially when they look clean and healthy.

Infection can be picked up from the animal's body, its poo or from areas where animals have recently been. If the bugs are on your hands, you could accidentally pass them to your mouth. You can't see the germs, so your hands may appear clean.

Washing your hands thoroughly with soap and hot running water immediately after you have had contact with animals will reduce the risk of infection. Hand gels or wipes are not a substitute for washing your hands with soap and hot running water.

What to do when visiting a farm

Following the simple rules listed below will help to keep you and your children safe from infections that may be found on open farms. Pregnant women need to take particular care as infections acquired from animals can be harmful to them and their unborn baby.

- do wash your hands thoroughly with soap and water after you have touched animals, fences or other surfaces in animal areas
- · do wash your hands thoroughly with soap and water before eating or drinking

- do remove and clean boots or shoes that might have become soiled and clean pushchair wheels. Then wash your hands thoroughly with soap and water
- do supervise children closely to ensure that they wash their hands thoroughly
- do eat and drink in picnic areas or cafes only
- do not put hands on faces or fingers in mouths while petting animals or walking round the farm
- do not kiss farm animals or allow children to put their faces close to animals
- do not eat or drink while touching animals or walking round the farm. This includes not eating sweets, crisps or chewing gum
- do not eat anything that has fallen on the floor
- do not use gels or wipes instead of washing hands with soap and water. Gels and wipes do not remove bugs in dirt

If you are planning a school or group visit to a farm, you also need to make sure that you've considered all the risks and taken steps to manage them. Guidance is available to help schools and teachers do this (see further information).

What should I do if I feel unwell after a farm visit?

If you or anyone in your group feels unwell or has any symptoms, for example is sick or has diarrhoea within 2 weeks of visiting a farm, contact your GP or call NHS 111 as soon as possible. If you or anyone in your group, particularly a young child, has bloody diarrhoea, seek immediate emergency medical attention.

Anyone who has experienced sickness or diarrhoea after visiting a farm could pass the illness on to others, so they should not attend work, school or nursery until they have been free of symptoms for at least 2 days. However, with infections from some bugs, extra tests may be needed to ensure they have fully recovered and will not pass on the infection to others before starting back at work, school or nursery. People who handle food, children under 5 years and those who work closely with people who may be vulnerable to infections should discuss with their GP or local health protection team before returning to work, school or nursery.



Advice to Teachers and Others who organise visits for children Code of Practice: Teacher's Guide

ADVICE TO TEACHERS AND OTHERS WHO ORGANISE VISITS FOR CHILDREN

This advice is for teachers and others who organise visits for children. It explains actions that you can take to reduce the risk of ill health arising from contact with animals.

All animals naturally carry a range of micro-organisms, some of which can be transmitted to humans, where they may cause ill health. Some of these, such as *Escherichia coli 0157* (*E. coli 0157*) or *Cryptosporidium parvum* (a microscopic parasite), present a serious health hazard and have the potential to cause serious illness and health problems which may be particularly severe in young children, the elderly, or those with reduced immune systems.

As with many other educational or recreational activities, visits can never be considered free from all risk. However, while the hazards are real, the risk of infection in children can be readily controlled by simple everyday measures. The following practical steps will help make your visit even more safe, healthy and enjoyable.

Before your visit, you should:

- Read the Industry Code of Practice, so that you understand what control measures the farm should have in place. You can then discuss arrangements for your visit with the management at the site.
- Confirm that the control measures provided at the site match the recommendations in the Industry Code of Practice.
- Seek advice from your local authority or organisation on what the appropriate ratio of pupils to teachers/leaders/assistants/parents should be.
- Discuss and agree with the supervisors, parents or staff of the school, crèche leaders or youth organisations etc. their roles and responsibilities during the visit. In particular, they must understand the need to make sure that the children wash, or are helped to wash, their hands thoroughly in the following four situations: after contacting animals, before eating, before and after using play equipment, and when leaving site.
- Before your visit, cover at least the following key points with the children:
- Explain the rules for the visit, including stressing that they must not eat, drink or chew anything (including sweets) outside the areas in which you permit them to do so.
- Explain why they must wash their hands thoroughly after contact with the animals, before eating or drinking anything etc.
- Demonstrate how to wash their hands properly.
- Discuss the requirements for appropriate clothing, including suitable footwear. You should liaise with the attraction to ascertain what this is.
- Checking that cuts, grazes etc on children's hands are covered with a waterproof dressing.

During and after the visit, make sure that the children:

- Are reminded of the rules while on the site.
- Do not kiss animals.
- Always wash their hands thoroughly before eating, after any contact with animals, before and after using any play equipment, and again before leaving the site.
- Eat only food that they have brought with them or food for human consumption that they have bought on the premises, in designated areas.
- Never eat food that has fallen to the ground.
- Never taste animal foods.
- Do not suck fingers or put hands, pens, pencils or crayons etc. in mouths.
- Where possible, clean or clean and change their footwear before leaving. The site should have facilities to clean footwear as you leave the site.
- Wash their hands after cleaning/changing their footwear

Check that the children stay in their allocated groups during the visit, and that they:

- Do not use or pick up tools (e.g. spades and forks) or touch other work equipment unless permitted to do so by site staff.
- Do not climb on to walls, fences, gates or animal pens etc.
- Listen carefully and follow the instructions and information given by the site staff.
- Approach and handle animals quietly and gently.
- Do not chase, frighten or torment the animals.
- Do not wander off into unsupervised or prohibited areas e.g. manure heaps.
- Know what to do if they get separated from the group for any reason.

Remember the children are your responsibility during the visit:

- You should supervise them during the visit, especially during hand washing to make sure that each child washes thoroughly. Site staff may be able to help with this supervision.
- Allow plenty of time for hand washing before eating or leaving the site so that the children do not have to rush.

What to do if you or any of your party become ill after a visit:

- If a member of your group shows signs of illness (e.g. sickness or diarrhoea) after a visit, advise them or their parent/guardian to visit the doctor and explain that they have had recent contact with animals.
- Please also contact the attraction you visited and inform them of the illness.

Coach Parking & Driver Instruction

On arrival at the park, the coach parking is immediately to your right as you enter the top of the drive, with a 5mph speed limit in place.

If a Marshall is present at the time of arrival, you MUST follow their instructions which are in guidance with out Health & Safety Procedures.

All coaches are to drive in FORWARDS into allocated spaces, allowing the children to safely exit the coach onto the tarmac path to avoid walking through the high-risk area of oncoming vehicles and coach blind spots.

Under no circumstances are coaches to drive down the drive, past the grass car parking area, manoeuvre within or leave the coach parking area unless it is to leave the park completely.

These instructions are for the safety of all visitors, including coach arrivals, therefore any driver found to disregard these instructions will be reported for breaching our Health & Safety Procedures.
